

National Indigenous History Month Classroom Activities

Gwekwaadziwin – Honesty/Courage



Gwekwaadziwin: gweh-kwah-di-zi-win Ma'iingan: my-een-gun

The teaching for Honesty requires us to look inward and to understand ourselves. Honesty is represented by different animals, but here I will share the teaching I was given about Ma'iingan (wolf). For Ma'iingan, survival is dependent upon knowing himself, his abilities, and his role in the pack. So, understanding his own strengths and limitations is key to maintaining a strong pack. Like any other close-knit group, wolves have disagreements and individuals sometimes challenge the leader. The Ma'iingan that is motivated to make a challenge is aware of his own abilities, and so in an effort to keep the pack strong, he is able to challenge the leader.

Follow Up Activity Ideas

Questions to Prompt Discussion

- What are your strengths?
- What are your limitations?
- How does knowing your strengths and limitations help you to succeed?


Land Connection

Draw a picture of other animals (or insects) that work together to survive.

- How are these animals showing awareness of their strengths?
- In what way(s) are these animals like Ma'iingan?

- Just Being Honest: Before the song starts, what happened when the friends tried to lie to their friend on the phone? How does this remind you of the teaching about Honesty?
